Randall Dodd is a Senior Financial Sector Expert at the IMF where he focuses on financial analysis and financial market regulation. From 2000 to 2007, he served as the director of the Financial Policy Forum in Washington, D.C. while also teaching MBA and MA courses in finance, regulation and development. Prior to that, his work specialized in over-the-counter derivatives and clearing operations at the Commodity Futures Trading Commission as an economist and as a special advisor to Commission. Between 1990 and 1996, he served as a senior economist in the U.S. Congress for the Joint Economic Committee and the Democratic Study Group, and as the Legislative Director for Congressman Joe Kennedy. He has taught economics, finance and political philosophy at Columbia, Johns Hopkins, Rutgers, Maryland, the Maxwell School of Syracuse University and American University. He received his PhD in economics from Columbia University.
