Mr. Krimminger is Special Advisor for Policy to the Chairman of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. He assists in analysis of banking industry innovations and the development of responsive policies on a variety of issues. Mr. Krimminger has been extensively involved in contingency planning for resolutions and receiverships, banking charter and capital issues, international and large bank resolution issues, financial modernization, payment systems, derivative and similar financial contracts and related issues. He has represented the FDIC on several interagency and international working groups to develop improved resolution practices and legislative initiatives to respond to the changing banking environment.

Before working with the FDIC, he practiced banking law and litigation in Los Angeles and Washington, D.C. Mr. Krimminger is a graduate of the University of North Carolina and received his J.D., with Distinction, from Duke University School of Law, where he served on the Editorial Board of the Duke Law Journal. Mr. Krimminger has spoken at a wide variety of international conferences on banking issues and published a number of analyses of banking and insolvency issues.
