Paul Hinton is a Vice President in the Securities Practice at NERA Economic Consulting. He provides expert testimony in securities and commercial litigation, and economic studies for public and private corporate clients. With over 15 years of experience, his cases have included analysis of the economic effects of corporate misstatements, breaches of fiduciary duty, collusion, fraudulent conveyance, suitability and breaches of contract. These economic analyses have involved event studies, valuation of securities, evaluation of accounting and tax effects, and modeling relative performance against market benchmarks.

His advisory work applies empirical analysis to help clients better understand critical business issues. For example, he developed data with which to measure the historical returns on earthquake reinsurance as a benchmark for the expected performance of CAT bonds. In mortgage finance his experience includes analysis of the effect on Fannie Mae's cost of funds of certain accounting misstatements. For pharmaceutical clients he modeled the effect on tort costs of alternative regimes for managing product liability litigation.

Mr. Hinton earned his BA from Oxford University and a Masters in Public Policy from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. Mr. Hinton's recent publications include an article on clawbacks in Ponzi scheme litigation and a chapter contributed to the forthcoming Practising Law Institute Covered Bond Handbook.
